At two story rectangular structure has three gables, one is predominant. An open porch curves into a sunporch. Siding is of shiplap construction on the exterior with a fishscale shingle sheathing the porch. The medium pitched roof creates an uneven roofline and is of composition shingle. Architecturally, the house has elements of Queen Anne style with decorative sunbursts over windows, uneven roofline and dormer windows. The curved front room was possibly a former open verandah. The porch is sagging and the structure is in need of paint and repair.

| 19. | Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.) The wood frame house at 726 Buchon is an interesting example of local builder hybridization of the Carpenter Gothic Revival style with Victorian appliques and a Neo-Colonial porch. Though it lacks any true stylistic categorization, the house is architecturally noteworthy with elements of the Queen Anne style: dormer windows, decorative sunbursts over the windows, a curved front room that encloses what probably was once an open porch, an irregular roofline and shiplap siding on various parts of the exterior. Built around 1900, J.A. Dunbar, a repairman, lived here in 1904. Miss Kate Cox, listed in 1901 as a member of the Twentieth Century Club, was a householder in 1912. By the 1920's, Mrs. Jessie Wright owned the building and used it as a maternity home. The wife of one of the prominent physicians of this era, Dr. Richard Bradbury, worked at the home as a nurse. The house was turned into a boarding house by the 1930's and today it is a private residence. Though in need of repair and maintenance, this house is an architecturally unique, vernacular and eclectic contribution to the "Nob Hill" row of Victorian structures that line this block.
