- 7b. Briefly describe the present *physical description* of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

A wide, generously roofed verandah wraps around the front and side of a large two-story corner house. Wide overhanging eaves with deep frieze, and amply proportioned columns support the porch roof rising from a closed railing that is covered with varied decorative fishscale and other shingles. The front door is stained and varnished with a beveled edge oval window. Stained/leaded glass extends across top of front windows. There are slanted bay windows on the front and the side of the upper floor and side of the lower floor. The rear portion of the house is one story. The structure is well painted and maintained.

SIGN 19.	NIFICANCE Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (includ	e dates, events, and persons associated with the site.)				
	This house is a prime illustration of Colonial Revival architecture in San Luis Obispo as it appeared after the turn of the century. The symmetry and formality of the two story classic box is evident from the medium pitched hipped roof, classical proportioned windows, compressed slanted bays, and wrap-around porch bordered by Doric columns. This residence was constructed between 1904 and 1908 and is one of the earliest Classical Revival "American Four Squares" in the city. The two houses east of 751 Buchon, on the same side of the street are also Neo-Classic designs, but they were erected later in the early teens. In 1914, 751 Buchon was the home of Ed Kaiser, a cigar dealer and bar owner, and his wife Annie. Today the house stands well trimmed and, amidst the Victorian transitional Neo-Classical styles of the old Murray and Church district, it is a vivid symbol of early 20th century architecture in San Luis Obispo.
