- 7b. Briefly describe the present physical description of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

A high pitched gable tops the front of this house. Stick work, fishscale and other shingle design applied in relief and unusual grouping of three window panels on a gable front are eye-catching features of this style. A doorway recessed into the house front with Corinthian columns at the front of the porch on the top of the wooden steps. An additional door is inside a porch wall. Double hung windows are on the ground floor and have a shelf top and molded surroundings. Clapboard siding on the front and side of the ground floor, with side facing gables on the upper floor also ornamental. On one side, an original window has been replaced with multi-pane French doors, reached by a wooden staircase.
